# **CANON VIXIA HF R30**

\*Battery may have to be charged before use.

### **Using the Camera**

- 1. Open the screen located on the left-side of the camera by sliding it outward (The screen can be rotated forward).
- 2. Turn on the camera by pressing the **POWER** button, located above the battery (indicated by green light).
- 3. Open the lens cover by sliding the button located near the lens (the right-side of the camera) downward.
- 4. To record, press the red **START/STOP** button located on the right-side of the battery. Press once to start recording and press again to stop recording.
- 5. To zoom in/out, slide the button located on the top of the video camera (shield-shaped button).
  - a. To zoom in, slide to the right (to **T** Direction).
  - b. To zoom out, slide to the left (to W Direction).
- 6. To view the video, press the display button (the bottom button) located on the video camera.
- 7. Select the video to watch it.

### **Deleting Past Data**

- 1. Press the display button (the bottom button) located on the video camera, to show the past data.
- 2. Press the **Edit** button located on the screen.
- 3. Press the **Delete** button.
  - a. To delete all data on the camera, press the **All Scenes** button.
  - b. To delete individual data, press the **Select** button, select the video that you want to delete (indicated by check-mark) and press the **OK** button to delete.

## **Setting White Balance**

- Press HOME (button on camera) → Main Functions (on Screen) → White Balance → Custom WB (first button from the right).
- 2. Hold the PORTA-BRACE white balance card in front of the lens and zoom in until the entire screen is filled with the card.
- 3. Press **Set WB** and wait until the blinking icon disappears.
- 4. Press the **X**-Button (top right of screen) to close.



## **Selecting Video Format**

- 1. Press **HOME** button (on camera) → **Recording Standard** (on Screen).
- 2. Select the last button from above to change the video format to MP4 (recording time will be decreased).
- 3. Press **OK** button to close.

### **Selecting Video Quality**

- 1. Press **HOME** button (on camera) → **Other Setting** (on Screen).
- 2. Scroll down the screen until you find **Recording Mode** and press the **triangle** button located on the left of it.
- 3. Select the video quality you desire (MXP/FXP/XP+/SP/LP)

a. MXP: High Quality 24 Mbps

b. FXP: High Quality 17 Mbps

c. XP+ : High Quality 12 Mbps

d. SP: Standard Play 7 Mbps

e. LP : Long Play 5 Mbps

4. Press X-button after selecting to close.

#### **Transferring Data from SD-CARD**

- 1. Plug the SD-CARD to the memory card reader.
- 2. Plug in the memory card reader to the computer.
- 3. For PC users:
  - a. For video recorded in HD Quality, Open MyComputer  $\rightarrow$  CANON(E:)  $\rightarrow$  PRIVATE  $\rightarrow$  ACVHD  $\rightarrow$  BDMV  $\rightarrow$  PLAYLIST to see the video data.
  - b. For video recorded in mp4 Quality, Open MyComputer → CANON(E:) → DCIM→ 101 CANON to see the video data.
- 4. For Mac users:
  - a. For video recorded in HD Quality, Open MEMORY (New Icon in Desktop) → PRIVATE → ACVHD → BDMV → PLAYLIST to see the video data.
  - b. For video recorded in mp4 Quality, Open MEMORY (New Icon in Desktop) → DCIM→ 101 CANON to see the video data.

\*mp4 video format is recommended for better compatibility. For HD Quality video, an .mpl video player (Windows Movie Maker, VLC Media Player, etc.) is needed.



## **Battery setup**

- To detach the battery, slide the Battery Release button located on the bottom part of the camera downward. While holding the button, slide the battery downward.
- 2. To attach the battery, slide the Battery Release button located on the bottom part of the camera downward. While holding the button, slide the battery upward
- 3. To charge the battery, plug the charger jack into the port located below the red **START/STOP** button.
- 4. Plug the adapter to an outlet to start charging (indicated by red light).

\*An extra battery is provided for back-up.

### **Memory Card Setup**

- 1. Open the screen located on the left-side of the camera by sliding it outward
- 2. To detach the memory card, open the SD-CARD cover located near the display button by pulling it outward. Press the memory card in to release it.
- 3. To reinsert the memory card, open the SD-CARD cover located near the display button by pulling it outward.
- 4. Press the memory card in to secure it.
- 5. Close the SD-CARD cover.

### Attaching the Video Camera to a Tripod

- 1. Detach the Camera Plate from the tripod. (Refer to Manfrotto Tripod Instructions on how to detach camera plate.)
- 2. Put the screw of the Camera Plate into the screw hole of the Video Camera. The gold peg should go to the smaller hole next to the screw hole.
- 3. Turn the screw clockwise to secure. Make sure the plate is parallel with the camera.
- 4. Reattach the Camera Plate to the tripod.

## **Detaching Video Camera from a Tripod**

- 1. Detach the Camera Plate from the tripod. (Refer to Manfrotto Tripod Instructions on how to detach camera plate.)
- 2. Turn the screw counter-clockwise to loosen.
- 3. Take the plate off the video camera.
- 4. Reattach the Camera Plate to the tripod.



<sup>\*</sup> An additional SD-CARD reader may be needed to transfer data for some users. An extra SD CARD is provided for back-up.

# **MANFROTTO TRIPOD**

## Leg Setup

- 1. Open the tripod by pulling the legs outward.
- 2. To extend the leg, pull the lever on the locking collar. There are two locking collars that can be opened in each leg to adjust to the desired height.
  - a. The top locking collar will extend the middle section.
  - b. The bottom locking collar will extend the lower section.
- 3. To lock the leg(s), push the lever back on to the locking collar.

### **Adjusting Central Column**

- 1. To loosen the column, turn the knob in the central column counter-clockwise.
- 2. Adjust the height of the central column to the desired height.
- 3. To lock the column, turn the knob in the central column clockwise.

## Using the Pan Bar

- 1. To adjust the bar position, turn the knob located next to the bar counterclockwise. The bar can be moved vertically and rotated on its axis.
- 2. To lock to the bar, turn the knob located next to the bar clockwise.
- 3. The bar can be attached on either side of the head.
  - a. To detach the bar, turn the knob located next to the bar counter clockwise until the bar can be removed.
  - b. To attach the bar, turn the knob located next to the bar clockwise until the bar is secured.

## **Moving the Tripod Head**

- 1. To turn the camera to the right or left (panning movement), turn the knob located near the base (near the spirit level) in counter clockwise direction.
- 2. To turn the camera up or down (tilting movement), turn the knob located below the red-unlocking button in counter-clockwise direction.
- 3. To lock the head movement, lock one or both of the knobs mentioned above by turning the knob in clockwise direction until secured.

## **Releasing Camera plate**

- 1. Detach the camera plate by turning the knob above the Velcro counter clockwise.
- 2. Slide the camera plate backward, to the direction of the pan bar, while pushing the red-locking button to remove the camera plate.
- 3. To reattach the camera plate, slide it back into the stage. You should hear a clicking sound from the red-locking button.



# **AUDIO-TECHNICA PRO 88W-830**

## **Microphone Setup**

- 1. Attach the antenna to the top-side of the receiver by turning it clockwise until it is secured.
- 2. Switch the power to **ON** (indicated by red light).
- 3. Attach the microphone to the top side of the transmitter (to **Mike Input**) by plugging in the 3.5mm jack.
- 4. Switch the power to **ON** (Indicated by red light).
- 5. Switch the Microphone to **ON**, located on the battery housing (black tube)
- 6. Make sure the frequency of the receiver and the transmitter is the same (A or B)

### Using the microphone

- 1. Plug-in the 3.5mm jack of the spiral-cable into the receiver (to **MIKE OUT**) located on the right-side of the receiver.
- 2. Plug-in the other 3.5mm jack of the spiral-cable to the microphone input of the device being used to record audio (Computer/Video Camera).
- 3. Make sure the receiver, transmitter and microphone are **ON** before using.
- 4. If using a tripod, the transmitter can be attached to the tripod using the Velcro.

\*The transmitter can be attached to the user's belt, using the built-in clip. For the best quality, make sure the receiver and transmitter are between 10-15 feet from each other.
